Reflection

I wonder what is the strangest Christmas present you have ever received? On an official visit to Scotland earlier in the year, the Princess of Wales disclosed that she had once received a chainsaw!

In our Gospel reading today it is Joseph who receives news of an unexpected gift. In Luke's Gospel it is Mary who is the focus of attention in the birth narratives but in Matthew's Gospel it is her husband to whom an angel appears. The angel tells him that his wife will bear a son; he is to be named Jesus 'for he will save the people from their sins.'

All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: 'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel which means 'God is with us'

How strange is this? Not simply a gift from God, which is true of every child born! But the gift of God himself! Most of the time I wonder if they understood what had just been promised to them in any sense at all! He was a gift who was to bring them the greatest joy and break their hearts.

The Methodist Church has run a media campaign this Christmas on the theme 'Gifted'. Posters have appeared on the streets of London and material has been made available on-line. Here in the Staffordshire Moorlands, some of us have been using that material in our weekly Advent fellowship group — looking at ourselves as God's great gift (which we sometimes don't acknowledge!), and then thinking through how our churches can be 'gift' in our communities, hope and encouragement.

A short video has been produced for each week in Advent featuring the President of the Methodist Conference, the Rev Richard Andrew and the Vice-President, Matt Forsyth.

They speak of the gifts we have received - and continue to receive- through the coming of Jesus. The gifts of Peace, Justice and Joy - and this week the most amazing gift of 'God with us'. Not 'throned above' but fully involved in the warp and weft of our daily lives. We are reminded that we are called to be gifts to others.

As we receive the gift of peace, is there a relationship we know of when we might begin to attempt some work of reconciliation? As we receive the gift of justice, what might our Church be doing to help shape our local community to make it fairer?

As we receive the gift of joy, where are we seeing signs of joy this Christmas and how can we share them?

The greatest gift we have is the knowledge that none of this we do alone. And we are not alone. In Jesus 'God is with us' and today he is to be found in each other - neighbour and stranger alike.

As Christmas draws near, I wish you the peace of the Christ-child in ways which will be life-changing for you – and for those around you. **Amen.**
