Reflection

Adventure

I wonder if you have been on an adventure this year? I have been privileged to go on two. The first to Scotland on a coach trip and the second a visit to Croatia, with my brother Robert, sister Pam and brother-in-law Dave. Each adventure began with some preparation. What shall I pack, have I got the right clothes, will I get them all in the case? The list was endless. Many years ago, I knew a couple who when they went away, got out their cases and inside was a spreadsheet of the things they needed to take with them. On the spreadsheet was a column that was to be ticked when each item was put into the case. Those who know me well, know that I do not work like that, sometimes I wish I did, it would be a lot less stressful.

As we work towards the end of Advent, do you feel like you've been on a journey with the prophets, Elizabeth and Zechariah, Mary and Joseph and the many others who have contributed to the fulfilment of God's promise of the coming of the Messiah or has it been same old, same old.?

Today we focus on Mary, a young woman, who is pledged to be married to Joseph, both residents of Nazareth in Galilee. We can only imagine the excitement of Mary as she plans for her wedding. Her hopes and dreams, will she have a family, what will Joseph be like to live with?

Into this excitement and preparation comes the angel Gabriel, with a message from God. Perhaps bombshell would be a better word for what comes next. For Mary has been chosen to be the mother of the Messiah, Jesus. Wow!!! "Do not be afraid, Mary said the angel" Probably being afraid would only be one of the emotions I would be going through, if I were visited by an angel.

The next thing that Gabriel said to Mary must have caused an absolute shockwave through her. She is to conceive and give birth to a son and call him Jesus.

Wait a minute, she is not married, has not been intimate with Joseph, if she had, she could have been stoned to death for adultery, so how can it happen.

Gabriel explains what will happen, Joseph won't be the father, so there's no problem with adultery. The Holy Spirit will come upon her, and she will conceive. I would have loved to have been a fly on the wall when Mary told Joseph that she was pregnant, and he wasn't the father. Still, that's for later.

Mary's response to this bombshell is found in verse 38 "I am the Lord's servant, may your word to me be fulfilled." The passage goes on to record that Mary went to visit her cousin Elizabeth. We may speculate why, but it was probably to get away for a while and to share time with an older woman who herself was pregnant, having been chosen to be the mother of John the Baptist. To get used to the enormity of what was going to happen.

During this visit, Luke records Mary composing a song that we have come to know as the Magnificat. The penultimate 2 verses remind us why this event is to take place. "He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors."

To conclude:

Thank you, Mary, thank you Joseph, thank you to the many others throughout history, who enable God to fulfil his promise of the coming of the Messiah that we celebrate at Christmas. As we remember the first coming of Jesus, let us continue the **adventure** as we await the promise that Jesus will come again. AMEN
