Reading - Matthew 2:1-12 NIV - The Magi Visit the Messiah - After - Bible Gateway

Reflection

Wise men, Kings, Magi, strangers, outsiders - captivated by something they had never before seen in the night sky. A magical story of curiosity and dedication to that sense they had that something really special was going on here!

We like to place them in the stable with the other characters of this great narrative - it creates a 'tidy' and complete picture of a beautiful and heartwarming tale. The reality is of course, slightly different in that the kings (the story doesn't tell us how many there were, only that they brought three gifts!) arrived sometime after the birth of the Holy Child - many months after!

Their story is also on some level troubling, for alongside their genuine searching for truth, Matthew tells us that there are others who are seeking to manipulate them and use them for another agenda altogether!

As you re-read this beautiful, yet slightly troubling narrative, with its barely concealed hints at trouble yet to come, what does God say to you? Spend a few moments now, just reading it again - read it slowly, then pause and read it again, noticing the words which jump out for you....and offer your thoughts to God.

Here's what jumped out at me...

- Over the last year I have been amazed at the number of experiences I have had in and through which I have glimpsed something of the glory of heaven - in people and situations where I had not expected that encounter. And it strikes me that 'the

church' is not always very good at embracing such revelations, thinking ourselves the custodians of the whole truth (and not being particularly open to what others, strangers, travellers have to teach us)!

These travellers offered very strange gifts for a new-born baby - I wonder what the parents made of their treasures? Did they know anything of the significance of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh? Or did they simply realise that here were people who had come looking for a King, and welcome whatever they had brought with them as part of a precious and sacred act of devotion?

How do our churches engage with the communities around them in such a way as to welcome what others bring, genuinely seeking comfort, encounter, peace, transformation - without feeling the need to control how people behave, or where they sit, or what they believe, or how loudly they sing...?

Perhaps as this life-changing story comes full circle again for another year, we can together think through how others might be invited into its beauty in 2026, without the need to manage or control - and in doing that somehow become a bridge between earth and heaven. That would be a really good year!

What does this story say to you? How does the One whose glory rises upon you (for it does, you know!) speak to you today through this ancient text and give you life?! Amen.
